Using keyboard shortcuts to navigate in Google Earth:


Action	Shortcut (Windows& Linux)	Shortcut (Mac)
Move left	Left arrow	Left arrow
Move right	Right arrow	Right arrow
Move up	Up arrow	Up arrow
Move down	Down arrow	Down arrow
Rotate clockwise	Shift + Left arrow	Shift + Left arrow
Rotate counter-clockwise	Shift + Right arrow	Shift + Right arrow
Tilt up	Shift then click and drag down	Shift + Down arrow
Tilt down	Shift + Up arrow Shift then click and drag up	Shift + Up arrow
See first-person perspective	Ctrl then click and drag	⌘ then click and drag

Gogle Earth On Android App:

- **See a new location:** Drag finger in the direction you want to see.
- **Zoom in:** Tap the screen twice with one finger.
- **Zoom out:** Tap the screen twice with two fingers.
- **Rotate or tilt your view:** Place two fingers on the screen and turn them the direction you want to see. You can move up, down, or sideways.

Google Earth on iPhone & iPad Apps:

Search for a location:

1. Open the Google Earth app.
2. In the top right, tap Search . 
3. In the search box, enter the place you want to see.

Note: The accuracy of a location depends on your device, your Internet connection, and the strength of GPS signals in the area.

- **See a new location:** Place one finger on the screen and drag it in the direction you want to see.
- **Zoom in:** Tap the screen twice with one finger.
- **Zoom out:** Tap the screen twice with two fingers.
- **Rotate or tilt your view:** Place two fingers on the screen and turn them the direction you want to see. You can move up, down, or sideways.

Use your device to tilt your view

When you turn on Autotilt, you can tilt the view by tilting the device. Follow these steps to turn Autotilt on or off.

1. Open the Google Earth app
2. In the top, left, tap Menu > Settings > Autotilt

Choose what you see in a location:

1. Open the Google Earth app
2. In the top left, tap Menu
3. Under "Layers," choose the content you want to see on the map.
4. To close the menu, tap Menu . The icons for each layer will appear on the map.
5. To see more info about a layer, tap the icon

See location coordinates and altitude:

1. Open the Google Earth app
2. In the top left, tap Menu .
3. At the bottom, tap Settings > Position
4. Under "Show position as," choose how you'd like to see the longitude, latitude, and altitude shown from the formatting list.
5. Under "Altitude units," tap **Feet** or **Meters**.
